


#### WHAT is STROKE?

Interruption of blood flow to the brain, resulting in damage to the brain tissue.

# There are TWO TYPES of STROKE

- Ischemic Stroke
- Hemorrhagic Stroke


#### ISCHEMIC STROKE



Blockage in an artery in the brain caused by a blood clot.

#### HEMORRHAGIC STROKE




Bleeding into the Brain when a blood vessel bursts.

## WHAT is a TIA? (TRANSIENT ISCHEMIC ATTACK)

- Symptoms of a stroke that last only for a short time. (minutes, up to approx 1 hour)
- A "mini strokes" or "warning strokes".
- TIA can be followed by a full stroke.
- Seek immediate medical attention. (nearest ER or call 911)




### SIGNS and SYMPTONS of a STROKE or TIA?

- sudden Weakness/Numbness
   Sudden loss of strength or sudden numbness in the face, arm or leg even if temporary
- sudden Trouble Speaking
   Sudden difficulty speaking or understanding or sudden confusion, even if temporary
- sudden Vision Problems

  Sudden trouble with vision, even if temporary

## SIGNS and SYMPTONS of a STROKE or TIA?

- sudden Headache
   Sudden severe and unusual headache
- sudden Dizziness
   Sudden loss of balance,
   especially with any of the above signs

# There are TWO TYPES of RISK FACTOR for STROKE

- Non-modifiable
- Modifiable

#### NON-MODIFIABLE RISK FACTORS

- Age (>55)
- Family history
- Gender (more common in men than women)
- Ethnicity

   (high risk groups are Asian, African-American,
   & Aboriginal)

- Certain medical condition increase your likelihood of having a stroke or another stroke.
- Your doctor can prescribe specific treatment to control these conditions.....

## MODIFIABLE RISK FACTORS (MEDICAL CONDITIONS)

- Previous Stroke or TIA
- High Blood Pressure
- High Cholesterol
- Heart Disease
- Atrial Fibrillation
- Diabetes

Certain stroke risk factors are controllable through healthy lifestyle choices......

- Sedentary Lifestyle
- Overweight
- Excessive Alcohol use
- Stressful Lifestyle
- Smoking
- Cocaine/Ecstasy use
